- 4.0 **RECONVENE TO OPEN SESSION** President Maben reconvened the meeting to open session at 5:30 p.m.
- 5.0 REPORT OF ACTION TAKEN IN CLOSED SESSION President Maben announced that no action was taken regarding Item 3.1. Regarding Item 3.2, a MOTION was made by Todd Lowell and seconded by Steve Paul to approve the Expulsion Panel Findings of Fact for Student 2012/13-01 (passed with a 5-0 vote).

- 9.0 AUDIENCE/VISITORS PUBLIC DISCUSSION President Maben welcomed all visitors and invited them to speak on agenda items at the conclusion of the Board's discussion. She also invited visitors to speak at this time regarding non-agenda items and announced that the public portion of the meeting would be recorded. The following comments regarding non-agenda items were noted: California School Employees Association (CSEA) President Tiffany Pelkey invited all in attendance to attend a rally in support of education-related propositions on the November ballot (such as Proposition 30). The rally is scheduled for October 22 (3:30 pm 6:00 pm) on the corner of Sunset/Park Drive. Members of the Rocklin Teachers Professional Association (RTPA), school staff, and administrators have confirmed their intention to participate in the rally, to show their unified support.

Those who were present at the induction stated that it was a very special and impressive evening and were honored to share a career highlight with Superintendent Brown.

14.0 **INFORMATION AND REPORTS**

- 14.1 REPORT OF 2011-12 STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AND ASSESSMENT DATA The Educational Services led by Deputy Superintendent Todd Cutler presented recently released California Department of Education assessment data. Highlights of their report included the following data: Rocklin Unified achieved the highest overall Academic Performance Index (API) ranking of all Unified school districts in Placer County and the greater Sacramento area (increased by eight points from previous school year).
 - In Placer County, Rocklin High School ranked First Place with an API score of 888 and Whitney High School tied for Third Place with an API score of 868
 - Granite Oaks and Spring View Middle Schools and two non-charter elementary schools ranked in the top five, countywide
 - In grades 2-11, we had a 30% gain in the number of students who earned a perfect score on the California Standards Test
 - California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE) pass rates were outstanding (95% for ELA and 96% for Math)
 - Graduation rate of 91.84%

In addition, English Language Learner, Title I school/subgroups, Gifted and Talented Student (GATE), and Special Education assessment information was presented and discussed. Due to the tremendous hard work and achievements of the staff and students at Rocklin Elementary, they were able to meet all targets and not advance to Year 2 Program Improvement status. Victory High School parents/guardians will receive notification that the school is in Year I of Program Improvement and will detail what that means for the students. In conclusion, the District achieved many of its goals and will face new challenges head-on. More detailed information can be found on the District's Educational Services website.
