Online/Remote Learning for Students Beginning Thursday, March 19, 2020

Superintendent's Message:

As you know the Rocklin Unified School District will be closed until April 13, 2020 for students. The District is taking the necessary steps, under the guidance of the Placer County Public Health Department, to protect the health and safety of students, staff and those who visit our campuses. Should circumstances and dates for re-opening change, the District will notify families.

We are very grateful for your patience and trust as we all navigate this as a community.

We have created a one-stop location for all information and links for support as it relates to Online and Remote Learning Resources. This can be found on the RUSD Web Page at www.rocklinusd.org/Parents/RUSDKeepsConnected-OnlineRemote-Learning.

During the period that schools are closed, the District will continue to provide free school lunches and breakfasts for any child under the age of 18. Meals can be picked up at Whitney and Rocklin High Schools, Springview Middle School, and Antelope Creek and Sierra Elementary Schools from 11:00-1:00 p.m. from March 16 - April 13th. A child must be present for the food to be distributed.

RUSD staff has been developing curricula for online/remote learning opportunities for all students. By Wednesday, you will be contacted by your child's teacher(s) who will share information about how he or she will facilitate online or remote learning during the period of school closure. The expectation is that distance learning will begin for students on Thursday, March 19, 2020.

For students with Individual Education Plans (IEPs), RUSD Special Education staff will be communicating this week with families about online and remote learning opportunities and other necessary information such as upcoming IEPs.

These are new and challenging times with COVID-19 as we collectively take care of our students and employees. Thank you once again for your continued patience and understanding as our community and RUSD takes unprecedented measures in response to help slow the spread of COVID-19.
