HEALTH Information

We care about the health and safety of our entire RUSD family, including staff, students, their families and community members. Though there have been no cases of the Novel Coronavirus in Placer County, our district is still making the effort to provide helpful information and tips to those who are interested.

Furthermore, our custodial teams are taking additional precautions with their already in-depth cleaning schedules to ensure our campuses stay healthy. This year, they have added a probiotic cleaning regimen to each site, which assists in preventing the growth and spread of unhealthy bacteria.

Superintendent's Note and Highlight-- RUSD files lawsuit against JUUL Labs:



Hello again, RUSD families and staff!

Did you know-- since entering the market in 2015, JUUL has dominated the e-cigarette industry and now controls over 70% of the market? Reports found that in 2018, 3.6 million middle and high school students used e-cigarettes. Did you know that the National Institute on Drug Abuse found that the 2018 spike in nicotine vaping was the largest for any substance recorded in 44 years?

JUUL's aggressive, strategic marketing and product designs not only create an addiction crisis among youth consumers but also a widespread burden on school districts. This month, my colleagues and I are proud to share with you our district's decision to join other school districts across California in filing a lawsuit against JUUL Labs, Inc. for the company's role in cultivating and fostering an e-cigarette epidemic that disrupts the education and learning environment across the District. The suit was officially filed in the Placer County Superior Court on January 27, 2020 (Case No.SCV0044342).

Following an increase in the use of vaping products by students, largely within the district's middle schools, RUSD administrators, staff members and parents have applied countless resources towards ending the epidemic, including hopes to reduce the use of tobacco in partnership with the Rocklin Police Department.

The lawsuit seeks injunction and abatement to stop the e-cigarette epidemic, which has severely impacted the school districts by interfering with normal school operations. The District also seeks compensatory damages to provide relief from the district's financial losses as a result of students being absent from school, coordinating outreach and education programs regarding the health risks of vaping, and enforcement actions – such as vape detectors, video surveillance, and staff to monitor the school's property in an effort to combat the e-cigarette crisis. This legal action will not cost the district anything.

The RUSD Board of Trustees have heard concerns from staff members and families at an alarming rate. According to the California Healthy Kids Survey conducted in 2016 by the Placer County Health and Human Services Office, 36% of high school students within Placer County have admitted to using a vaping device.

JUUL Labs, Inc. is known for its use of child-centered advertising which includes promoting vape flavors that resemble fruit, candy and more. It is because of their lack of concern for their unintentional outreach to students that school districts across the nation have chosen to speak out against the company.

As we enter the initial phases of this legal action again JUUL Labs, we thank you for your continued support and awareness of student health and positive social growth within our Rocklin community. We are eager to update you on the results of this nation-wide pursuit against youth vaping!
